CUES Individual Grants 2019-2020

Personal projects and competitions
Technical conferences or seminars
Public lectures or research projects
Charitable development initiatives
Other professional development activities

Applications will be accepted **throughout the academic year** via online submission at: <http://cues.org.uk/grants/>

Received applications will be reviewed according to the following timeline:

- **Submissions received before 17th November 2019** – Decision by 30th November 2019
- **Submissions received before end of Week 3 Lent Term**– Decision by End of Week 6 Lent Term 2020
- **Submissions received before end of Week 5 Easter Term**– Decision by End of May Week 2020

Current undergraduate and graduate students of the University of Cambridge may apply. The applicant must be a member of CUES or join through cues.org.uk before submitting the application.

The CUES Group Project Grant has historically ranged between **£250-£1000**. Activities taking place at any time from the **start of term which the application is to be reviewed** to the **next submission deadline** will be considered. A panel composed of CUES Executive Committee members and CUED Faculty Members will review all applications, and their decision is final.

The CUES Individual Grant has historically averaged between **£100-£200**, but there is no strict limit as long as the expense is clearly justified. Please note:

- This is not a substitute for College Travel Grant schemes or Department Grant schemes. It must be outlined how alternative funding methods are being pursued.
- The application must clearly outline the costs of the activity. Eligible expenses include conference and competition registration fees, materials

and equipment purchases and limited travel costs. Accommodation and personal expenses (such as meals) are not eligible for support.

- As the CUES Grant scheme is primarily a projects fund, Graduate members are expected to exhaust all funding options available from the department and professional associations before pursuing an application in relation to an academic conference. In such a case, please also clearly indicate whether the activity would be undertaken if only partial funding of the amount requested was available.

CUES reserves the right to amend any of the details of the CUES Individual Grant scheme at any time.
